## STATE OF TERESA A. TAYLOR

## EXAMINATION BY DETECTIVE JEFF BROWN:

Q. We are present, here, at the Ashtabula City Police Department. It's Monday evening, the 17th, approximately 20 minutes after 10:00 p.m. Present are myself, Detective Jeff Brown from the sheriff's department; Detective Jim Oatman of the city police, and two perspective witnesses in the shooting investigation being conducted this evening.

The first witness is Teresa Taylor, and her mother is present, Lillie Taylor-Lathan; is that correct?

MS. TAYLOR-LATHAN: Yes.

- Q. Teresa, we would like to talk to you first, and you understand, you are on camera, correct?
- A. Yeah.

- Q. And I want you to be relaxed, we are going to ask you a few questions, here, to get you started and then I want you to, again, totally relaxed and just tell the story as you remember it. Take your time, there's no rush here, you know, if there's silence, don't worry about the silence and rush into something. If you make a mistake and you need to correct yourself, feel free to do that.
  - Would you please state your full name?
- A. Teresa Ann Taylor.
- 25 Q. How old are you?

- 2 Q. You live at what address?
- 3 A. 923 West 43rd.
- 4 Q. How long have you lived there?
- 5 A. Three years.
- This evening, or this afternoon, at

  approximately 4:30, I believe, as you told us prior to the

  taping, you had an occasion to witness shots being fired

  and a police officer being injured near your home. In your

  own words, would you tell us what you did see with your own

  eyes, from the beginning, correct?

DETECTIVE OATMAN: Like you told us when you first observed the people involved and if you can remember, also, when you are describing them to us, if you would describe what they are wearing, that would help a little bit, too.

At first, I looked out the window, the front door window, and I saw three males. They -- one was wearing a green and tan jacket, the other was wearing a Dallas Cowboy jacket, and the third one was wearing a green jacket. And, it looked like they were talking and they moved from in the front of my house to the east side, east part of it in the driveway. So, I moved from the front window to the side window and it looked like they were arguing, and the two -- and the one in the tan and green

jacket and the one in the Dallas Cowboy jacket cut through my yard and the third friend, he just, he left. They were 2 cutting through my yard and my mom, she was banging on the window to not cut through the yard, and they looked at her and they just ignored her and that's when they walked 5 towards the back of the fence, (inaudible) they walked down 6 the street and the police officer came from behind and he 7 asked -- said something to them. They started to run back 8 through my yard and cut through it on the other side and 9 the officer went around and, where they found the evidence, 10 11 the two people were back by the fence and the shooter pulled out a gun and his friend told him to put it down, 12 but he wouldn't listen to him and the officer got right 13 there, he saw the gun and he told him to put it down and 14 don't shoot, but he shot him and then it looked like the 15 16 officer fell and then he got right back up and he was telling him not to shoot and his friend kept telling him 17 18 not to shoot, and he shot him two more times and I saw the officer fall. 19

- Q. So, you are saying you saw and/or heard how many shots fired?
- 22 A. I heard exactly four.

23 Q. And you remember what the sequence of the
24 banging sound was? Was it close proximity, bang, bang, or
25 bang-bang-bang. Can you describe it?

1 It was a close, I could hear, really close, 2 it was like, bang, bang-bang-bang. Where were you at when you saw or heard this 3 0. 4 banging sounds? 5 I was in our bathroom looking out the window A. 6 and I heard--7 Q. Would you explain where the bathroom is 8 located? 9 A. The bathroom is located on the second floor. 10 Q. On which side of the home? 11 A. On the east part of the home. 12 MS. TAYLOR-LATHAN: South side? 13 Would it be the south side? 14 DETECTIVE OATMAN: No, east side. 15 MS. TAYLOR-LATHAN: Oh, it would 16 be the east side. 17 Q. When you saw these men on the sidewalk, you thought they were arguing, could you hear? 18 19 No. 20 Did you actually watch them at that point? And, you said one left, it was right then when they turned 22 into your yard? 23 A. No, they went down the street and that's when the police officer rode up and they saw him, and they 24 started running and he told them to stop, and they ran 25

through my yard, then he run around to where he was and 1 then the shooter -- the shooter and his friend, the ones in 2 the Dallas coat and the tan and green coat, were, um, they 3 were, like, about three feet away from the back fence and 4 they were directly across from where the officer was, on 5 6 the other side of the woods. 7 DETECTIVE OATMAN: When you said that the officer went around, do you mean that he followed 8 9 the two, or did he go another way? 10 A. He went another way. 11 DETECTIVE OATMAN: Did, like, beside another house or do you know, was it over by the 12 13 street, Coleman Avenue? Do you remember, like, did you 14 happen to see where between he went? 15 From where his car was in front of the house, the house where the shooting was, behind it, he went 16 towards Coleman Avenue. 17 18 DETECTIVE OATMAN: Like around 19 that house that he was parked in front of, to the east of 20 that house? 21 A. He went all the way around in the street, in 22 the road. 23 DETECTIVE OATMAN: So, he went around in the street? 24

- Q. Was there any particular reason that you took interest to watch that long?
- Jum, they -- there's certain people that hang
  they at our house a lot or they hang around on our streets, they
  usually cut through our yard, so we always keep a look out
  or watch out for the people going through there, 'cause
  sometimes they'll traffick in drugs in front of our house
  or near our house, that's why we keep a constant watch.
  - Q. At that early stage of everything that happened tonight, did you have any idea of who any of those individuals were?
- One in the Dallas coat was Jimmie Ruth, and
  I don't know the other one in the tan coat was.
  - Q. How do you know Jimmie Ruth?
- 15 A. I know him by my mom.

MS. TAYLOR-LATHAN: The girl's one of her friends that she goes to school with, Sandra, over on Station Avenue. I'm good friends with her mom and she's good friends with her daughter, so once in a while, we'll go by there and say hi. But, I know -- I can spot him any where's. If I've seen a picture of him, I know who he is. He's also a dealer, because I always see him hanging out on Station Avenue when I go to my sister's house, I am not sure what coat he had on, but I know, I know him if I see him.

When you saw the man down by the fence, and this may be hard to visualize for anyone listening to the tape or reviewing this, but we are going to back up everything you are telling us with photographs that we are taking out there, perhaps, we can also show those to you later, perhaps, if we need to.

You are describing down by the fence, which we've already been down there and we know where that's at. You saw two men and you heard gun shots. Did you see a gun in someone's hands?

- A. The one in the tan and green coat had the gun in his hands.
- When did you first, actually, detect, by seeing, there was a gun present?
- When he pulled it out of his pocket. He just pulled it straight out of his pocket, you could just see it, it was visible.
  - Q. And this, again, is down at, towards the fence area you are talking about?
- 20 A. (Moved head up and down.)

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- DETECTIVE OATMAN: Is that where
  he pulled it from his pocket, in the back area, or did he
  pull it out another time?
- 24 A. He pulled it out when he was back by the 25 fence.

Did you have site of the police officer as 1 2 he was pulling the gun? 3 A. Yes, I did. 4 Q. And where did you see the police officer? 5 The police officer was on the right side of A. 6 the garage by a boarded window. 7 MS. TAYLOR-LATHAN: You mean our 8 garage, or Lisa's garage? 9 A. It was our neighbor's garage. 10 MS. TAYLOR-LATHAN: That's the way 11 I seen -- that's the direction that I seen the guy with the 12 Green Bay Packer's hat on, green hat, and I told him to get ' 13 out of my yard, he ran that way. So, after they had done what they had did, he tried to cut through my yard and 14 that's when I told them to get out of my yard and one of 15 16 the guys, in the Dallas Cowboy hat, was going to follow the 17 guy in the Green Bay Packer's hat. I said get out of my yard. The guy in the Dallas outfit went down West Avenue, 18 19 up my street and the guy in the Green Bay Packer's hat, 20 continued to run through the fence over on West 41st 21 Street. 22 Q. Do you have any eye problems? 23 A. No. 24 Q. Did you ever have your eyes examined?

Yes. 13 Could you clearly see the officer through 14 all that? 15 A. Yes. 16 And you are certain that he was on the west Q. 17 side of the garage, near the boarded window? 18 A. (Moved head up and down.) 19 Was he one side of the other or sort of 20 centered with that window? 21 Um, sort of centered, on the left side of 22 the window.

15	because I know him, I know his family pretty well, to let
16	him know that one of the suspects is over across the
17	street, over there, watching this. It doesn't make sense.
18	But, he never got around to me, because he was more
19	concerned with helping this officer.
20	DETECTIVE OATMAN: When you saw
21	that man standing over there, did you see, I mean, mainly
22	the hat or could you see the face also?
23	MS. TAYLOR LATHAN: I from the
24	distance where I was at, I seen the hat. He did have a
25	dark green coat with tan on it and he I really couldn't

1 see his face, but it was a black person. 2 DETECTIVE OATMAN: We had clarified that. In the beginning, all the individuals you 3 4 saw were black males. 5 MS. TAYLOR-LATHAN: And so, I guess, somebody else must have pointed it out to an officer 6 that one of the suspects is over across the street. So, I 7 guess, they did apprehend him from over there on West 41st 8 Street. I don't know if they apprehended him or not, but I 9 10 looked around and I didn't see him standing there, but did 11 see some officers over there. 12 0. In the beginning, you saw three men? One 13 man left and two continued to the house on the east. 14 A. Yes. 15 Q. When the shots were being fired, you saw two 16 men? 17 A. Yes. 18 Q. Did you ever see a third man? 19 No. 20 0. Again--21 The other one, he just -- he left. I don't 22 know where, but he, he left towards West Avenue. 23 MS. TAYLOR-LATHAN: Did he leave

15	hand back, it looked like he was reaching for his gun and
16	that's when the first shot came, the shooter, in the tan
17	and green coat, probably just thought he was going to pull
18	his gun out and just shoot him right there. So, he
19	probably thought he was going to pull it out and he just
20	shot him.
21	MS. TAYLOR-LATHAN: Do you
22	remember seeing the officer with his gun in his hand?
23	Q. After the shots were fired, what did you see
24	then?
25	A. I saw the one, the kid that had the Dallas

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Cowboy jacket, he ran from where he was standing to, he ran

TAYLOR-LATHAN: Yes, I did. 6 DETECTIVE OATMAN: You watched 7 him? 8 MS. TAYLOR-LATHAN: I watched him, from my window, leave my yard, go up, cut through the fence 9 and go down 41st. He went down a little bit and, I guess, 10 he caught up with some people that were observing, standing 11 12 there, watching him walk back and forth. 13 DETECTIVE OATMAN: Wasn't it a few minutes though, and correct me if I am wrong, I am 14 trying to piece this together, wasn't it a few minutes 15 before the police got there, I mean, wasn't there a little 16 17 bit of time? 18 MS. TAYLOR-LATHAN: Right, that's when he ran, there was time before the cops got there. 19 That's when he ran back, after they did what they did and I 20 seen them coming through the yard, that's when he ran back 21 up through the fenced yard. His buddy went the other way 22 and he went up that way and I see him going down 41st 23 Street, before all the cops and stuff had gotten there.

are trying to tell us and I don't think we communicated real clear. You said he ran around the house, and did he go behind it, the garage? You are talking about, did he go behind the garage, down Coleman towards 41st Street and then come back up on the west side of the garage, or did he come between the house and that garage to the west side of the garage?
